1.2. PROJECT BACKGROUND

Fraser Alexander (Pty) Ltd operates and maintains Tailings Storage Facilities as contracted by Royal Bafokeng Resources. Tailings dams are known to have alien species called "Tamarisk plants" on top of the dam which can pose challenges to day-to-day operational activities such as depositing and wall building. We are required to eradicate and control these plants by cutting, treating, and burning cut branches on top of the dam in sections as per the planned schedule on site. t

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work shall entail the following:

In providing the services, the Contractor shall:

- 1) Cut, chemically treat, and burn tamarisk trees or branches on an area coverage of 6.5 hectares/65000 m² per month at BRPM Tailings Dam.
- 2) Cut stems not be more than 150mm/15cm above the ground.
- 3) Cut tamarisk stems to be chemically treated on the stump within same day of felling, not more than 12 hours exposed, to prevent regrowth.
- 4) Apply chemical with knapsack sprayer at 100 kPa pressure bar rating.
- 5) Provide chemical mix in the following proportion or as recommended by the Manufacturer's Specifications:
 - a. An estimate of Nuvogen 480 EC 5 litre x 8 and mix with diesel 1 litre x 8 to treat 65000m2
 - b. Mixing 5 litre of nuvugen in every 100 litre of water with 1 litre diesel for proper application.
- 6) All tamarisk branches to be stockpiled by hand picking method and left to dry and then burn on top of the dam with diesel if not flammable.
- 7) Small tamarisk branches to be rooted and sprayed using knap sack container.
- 8) Cut area of 6.3ha/65000m2 to be re-sprayed 2 more x times for intensive chemical application as soon as there is regrowth in the section, contractor to provide this chemical when there is evident of regrowth.
- 9) Only approved chemical to be used as approved by mine.

Technical adjudication consideration:

One of Fraser Alexander expectations regarding the potential Contractor ability and capacity to provide the services is that, previous knowledge of mine environment and exposure to tailings dam of the potential Contractor will be advantageous.

Safety and Other Requirements:

In ensuring compliance to Safety and Other Requirements, the Contractor shall

- Have one (1) legal appointed 2.9.2, OHSA requirement, to supervise and oversee the project who is competently trained in Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA), First Aid, Fire Fighter, and Legal Liability.
- 2) Have the Company Owner/Director(s) to sign-off 2.6.1 legal appointment, OHSA requirement, at the mine and is expected to be on site at least twice (2) a month.
- 3) Have an estimate of 8 or more employees on site, depending on the Contractor, to carry out the task to ensure all applicable procedures are met including but not limited to fatigue management, leave, job rotation, and meet all production targets in 30 days cycle.
- 4) Ensure that all employees to go through Mine Kroll Screening for criminal records and medical examination and attend a 2 day induction.
- 5) Ensure that all employees are trained and certified on bush cutter operation, chain saw, HIRA, Basic Hand Tools, fire fighter, and first aid.
- 6) Ensure that Company has been approved by Mine Supply Chain and meet minimum requirements. (e.g. door step policy)
- 7) Ensure that Mine Safety Department receives and audits Safety/SHE Pack File before commencing with the task.

4. SUPPLY REQUIREMENTS

4.1. PAYMENT TERMS

Fraser Alexander policy is to effect payment of a VAT invoice issued by the successful bidder within 30 (thirty) and 60 (sixty) of receipt of the statement days for Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME's) and all other suppliers from date of statement respectively for operational expenses.

4.2. B-BBEE REQUIREMENT AND LOCALISATION REQUIREMENT

5.9. SIGNING REQUIREMENTS

Any participating entity shall comply with the following requirements;
